Holocaust Memorial Day (HMD) is observed worldwide each year on 27 January, the anniversary of the 1945 liberation of Auschwitz-Birkenau, the largest Nazi death camp.

The Holocaust is central to Holocaust Memorial Day, and we remember the 6 million Jews murdered during the Holocaust. We also commemorate the millions of others who suffered under Nazi persecution, as well as those killed in the more recent genocides recognised by the UK government, and the genocide in Darfur.

HMD 2025 marks the 80th anniversary of the liberation of Auschwitz-Birkenau, the largest Nazi death camp, and the 30th anniversary of the genocide in Bosnia.
